

# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



## A MESSAGE FROM ALI

Hello families and welcome back to our final term for 2021. While the weather may not have been exactly Spring-like for much of the holiday break, I hope that you found opportunities to get out into the sunshine that we did have, and enjoy time with family and friends. The weather continues to surprise this week, with shorts and T-shirts on Monday and back to jackets and long pants today!

Now that we are into the final term we are focused not only on finishing the year well, but also busily getting ready for the 2022 school year. Preparations are well underway in the formulation of next year's timetable based on the selections that students have made during the subject counselling process. There will be some students for whom re-counselling will need to take place, either due to very low numbers choosing particular subject options meaning a class will not run, or if students have not met the required standard in current curriculum areas. If a student requires re-counselling, parents contact will take place, and should a student not be performing at the necessary standard, sub-school leaders will engage parents in conversations around an appropriate course of action.

Transition visits for our new Reception and Year 8 students for 2022 will occur across the coming term, and for our current Year 5 and 9 students, transition activities will take place toward the end of the term. Keep an eye out in the newsletter for these activities.

Thank you to the families who supported our Fundraising efforts by purchasing socks in recent weeks. We expect socks to be with us early next week and look forward to seeing some great ankles next Friday as we celebrate the end of formal lessons for our Year 12s with Crazy Sock Day! Your purchases have added \$923.89 profit toward our canteen refurbishment project - thanks again for your support.

As we approach the end of our three year Site Improvement Plan, we are undertaking the review and evaluation part of the improvement cycle and beginning to develop our next three year iteration. Our work to develop fluent reading skills in our early years learners through Read Write Inc, and provide effective strategies to enable our adolescent learners to deeply engage with and comprehend a range of texts through Reading Comprehension intervention in the Middle School, has proven beneficial, and we have seen huge growth in reading and comprehension as a result of our work. With established practices embedded, we will continue with this work, but will now build on our success and determine new goals and targets for our improvement work.

## A MESSAGE FROM ALI



At MDS we have a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) program for all students in Years 6 through to 12. We have found that personal ownership of a device has a huge impact on the effective and efficient use of laptops as a learning tool and reduces the likelihood of work being 'lost' in the transfer from school to home. After an internal review, we are opting to outsource procurement of devices from 2022 onward and have entered into an agreement with Learning with Technologies to be our provider. Parents will be able to order devices through a portal on the school website, and either pay outright or enter into an interest free 24 month payment plan to purchase a device. Having greater purchasing power, LwT will be able to deliver devices more quickly and will provide the same warranty as our previous digital device program. Aaron will still be available to support our students with laptop issues, and LwT will liaise with manufacturers to ensure that any issues are dealt with promptly. We are confident that the service offered will more than meet the needs of our students and families. Parents of current Year 5 students entering the Middle School, and prospective students for 2022 in either Middle or Senior years will receive a letter outlining the program in more detail. For any families who are considering an upgrade for their child/ren, please have a look at the school website using this link <https://www.minlatonds.sa.edu.au/studentdeviceprogram> - you will find everything you need to make your decision and place your order. If you have any specific questions, please direct them to Aaron, Zoe or myself.

In the latter part of Term 3 Minlaton District School participated in an external review. We have received our Review document, which outlines our future directions, and once ratified by the Governing Council the full report will be available for all parents to read on the school website. I have included the detail from the final page of the Review here for your perusal and congratulate our staff, students and school community on the outcome which reflects so well on our combined efforts. I look forward to engaging with all members of our school community to implement the directions put forward.

Outcomes of the External School Review 2021 Minlaton District School is a responsive learning community with a high degree of professionalism. A shared sense of ownership towards ensuring every young person is supported in their learning is highly evident. The school is to be commended on the sound processes they have established to ensure the school is on a continuous cycle of improvement, underpinned with effective conditions for learning. Educators are committed to using a range of high impact strategies and evidence-based programs to maximise engagement, wellbeing, and achievement. The school vision of 'By Deeds Not Words' was evident in the actions of staff and students.

The Principal will work with the Education Director to implement the following directions:

- Direction 1 - Engage students and families in collaborative analysis of data sets further ensuring they can effectively engage in and contribute to whole school planning and improvement.
- Direction 2 - Further enable students to become powerful partners in learning through supporting them to set goals based on the collaborative analysis of their own data.
- Direction 3 - Further develop teaching expertise using critical and constructive feedback from peer observations, with a mutually agreed targeted area of focus.

At our next Governing Council meeting on October 26th we will ratify the Materials and Services Charges for the 2022 school year. You will find the watermarked documents at the end of this newsletter. Should you have any comments about the M&S charges, you are more than welcome to attend the meeting, or can relay your feedback via myself, or any member of the Governing Council. Our meeting commences at 7.30 and in the staff room. The time will fly this term, there is much to do, and much to look forward to, but the end will be here before we know it!

Dear parents and caregivers,

The COVID-19 pandemic has been a worrying time for all of us.

The Delta COVID-19 variant is twice as infectious as the original COVID-19 strain and there are now more cases in children and young people.

Vaccination is the best way to protect you, your family, and your friends from getting sick, and reduce the risk of outbreaks and school closures.

**I encourage everyone aged 12 years and over in your household to get vaccinated against COVID-19 as soon as possible.**

COVID-19 vaccines in Australia are safe and many millions of Australians are already protected.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) has recommended both the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines for people aged 12 years and over in Australia.

Consent from a parent/caregiver for COVID-19 vaccination is required for anyone under the age of 16.

R-1 Classes - Read a current Read Write Inc book

Yr 2 Class - Read a levelled reader from the classroom

Yr 3/4 Class - Read a levelled reader from the classroom or a Guided Reading book

Yr 4 Class - Read from a book of their choice at their level or from a Guided Reading book

Yr 4/5 Class - Read a poem of their choice at their level or from a Guided Reading book



## Senior School News

Welcome back to Term 4. I trust that everyone (parents, students and staff) are feeling refreshed and ready to tackle the action packed last term of the year.

### Final Dates for Year 12 students

Last day to submit any school assessed work is 22nd October (Friday Week 2, Term 4). Most subjects will be finished school assessed work by then anyway, but any work still to be completed must be submitted by that time.

The last official day of school for Year 12 Students this year is Friday the 22nd of October. Before school that morning there will be a student and staff BBQ breakfast to celebrate the end of 13 years of schooling and the transition into the next phase of their lives. This will begin at approximately 8 am. Upon completion of the breakfast the Year 12s will move to their Care Group. In the first lesson of the day there will be a short assembly for the school to acknowledge the day for the Year 12s, upon completion of this assembly, students will return to their Care Group to meet with myself to finalise their clearance and exit procedures, participate in a range of final school activities and be dismissed by lunch time. **Students are to note that there is NO "Muck Up Day" tradition at MDS (Year 12s have already been spoken to about this).** Student clearances and predicted destination data collection must have been completed prior to this date. Year 12 exams run between Monday 1st November and Thursday 11th November.

Year 12 students are required to attend Presentation night.

Information around end of year arrangements has been sent home via a letter/email this week.

### Some dates for Year 10 & 11 students to be aware of for the remainder of the term:

12th November: Last day to finalise and submit Work Experience forms

23rd November: Final day to submit Year 10 & 11 work.

24th & 25th November: Senior School Transition (details TBC)

30th November - 11th December: Work Experience (details below)

It is timely to remind Year 10 & 11 students and parents that the successful completion of subjects currently being studied provides a solid foundation for future learning. Therefore, should a student not satisfactorily complete their course requirements in any senior subject, they will be ineligible for work experience and must attend school during the final two weeks of Term 4 when they will be provided with the opportunity to successfully complete these subjects in order to move into the next year level. Should a student be unsuccessful when provided this opportunity, then their promotion to the next year level will be closely reviewed.

### Term 4 Work Experience

End of year work experience for Year 10 and 11 students will be in the last 2 weeks of the year: 29th November to 3rd December and 6th December to 10th December. All Year 10 and 11 students **must complete at least one week of work placement during this period**, however due to the missed opportunity mid-year all are welcome to complete 2 weeks. Year 9 students who are over the age of 15 may also wish to undertake work experience in the second week. All relevant forms must be completed and returned to me no later than Friday 12th November.

Students are encouraged to get in early and find a placement (either locally or further afield) in an area of interest. Leaving it until the last minute often means students are left with few viable choices. Accessing work experience is a student driven process; this requires students to take the initiative by making phone calls and following things up, not parents. Work Experience forms are available upon request.


### SAPSASA GOLF 2021
