A bus service to Adelaide operates 4 days per week but there is no public transport or taxi service in proximity to the school.

2. Students (and their welfare)

General Characteristics

Minlaton District School officially became R-12 in 1992 for students of the surrounding communities of Minlaton, Brentwood, Hardwicke Bay, Port Vincent and feeder schools at Stansbury and Curramulka. In general, students are co-operative and reflect supportive family backgrounds and an active community. School Cardholders comprise 25% of the school population, reflecting the variety of socio-economic groups and there has been an increase in transient families in recent years. The school is serviced by five school buses that transport approximately 60% of the student population.

Resilience and Wellbeing Program (CPC)

All R-12 classes are involved in this program. It provides grounding for the years ahead and students will develop similar expectations regarding study and behaviour and build positive relationships with other students, staff and the community. The program also provides a focus on; student wellbeing, bullying, social skills, collaborative skills and values. The SHine program also supports student wellbeing and is incorporated through the HPE curriculum.

• Support Offered

All teachers are teachers of wellbeing and a Pastoral Care Worker/School Care Worker triages students of concern with a case management approach being undertaken by the leadership team with close links to outside agencies.

Student Management

Our school has a regularly reviewed Student Behaviour Management Policy in line with DfE Policy. Teachers establish classroom expectations with their students and a range of mechanisms are utilised across the school to support students to comply with these expectations. Teachers utilise whole school processes as required.

• Student Agency

Students have leadership opportunities at a variety of levels within the school. A House competition is lead by student leaders are involves all aspects of school life. Student leaders represent the school on formal occasions and run school assemblies. Students are able to form interest groups where further leadership opportunities and engagement in decision making arise. Training and staff support in both leadership and meeting management is provided.

• Special Programmes

Individual case management of students support their engagement, wellbeing and future pathways.

4. Curriculum

Subject Offerings

R-10 curriculum is based on the Australian Curriculum. A comprehensive range of SACE Stage 1 & 2 subjects is offered for Year 11-13 students. The middle and senior secondary sub-schools operate on a 5-day, six lesson timetable. By adopting 50 minute time slots across the school, teaching and non teaching staff are able to move more efficiently between R-12 classes and many teach across multiple year levels.

Open Access and Local Delivery

The Open Access College is used to supplement the range of curriculum offerings at SACE Stage 1 and 2. Students are able to access a range of

learning opportunities through neighbouring schools where subjects are not accessible within our school and MDS teachers also provide delivery to students from neighbouring schools. Students are supported with teacher mentors in designated subjects and supervised study time, and supported by School Support Officer time for administration and student monitoring.

• Special Needs

Students with disabilities are part of our mainstream classes supported by staff from DfE support services and other agencies. School Support Officers engage with individuals and small groups of students and follow specific programs designed by teaching staff to support their learning in areas of identified need. Specific programs support individual learning needs as required.

• Special Curriculum Features

A Year 10 Careers Trip to Adelaide is an annual event focussing on Tertiary / Industry and Business Site visits as well as orientation around city environs using public transport.

Students are encouraged to participate in VET programmes (both within and outside of school), School Based Apprenticeships and regular Work Experience.

The use of digital technologies and the Daymap system support these students to keep up with their subject requirements.

• Assessment Procedures and Reporting

A continuous assessment and reporting structure, student work samples, complemented by parent/teacher/student learning conversations and written reports is in place across R-12. The R-10 reports provide feedback on the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards. Year 11 and 12 reports are based on the SACE requirements.

The school actively participates in a wide range of sporting activities eg SAPSASA, SSSSA Knock Out and Yorke Peninsula Zone sports, Primary and Secondary Interschool Athletics, SSSSA Athletics, DfE aquatics programs.

Instrumental tuition is provided by DfE Instrumental Music Services teacher who visit the school on a weekly basis. Tuition is free and is currently available for woodwind and strings.

7. Staff (and their welfare)

Staff Profile

Minlaton District School has a competent, stable and committed staff, working across a range of learning areas, in each sub school (Primary; R-5, Middle; 6-9, Senior; 10-12). Staff in specialist areas work across year levels.

• Leadership Structure

Principal, Deputy Principal and three B1 leaders.

Staff Support Systems

A well structured performance management programme with regular meetings and verbal and written feedback is in place. Staff participate in Peer Observation and Feedback while mentoring and coaching are also undertaken to build the capacity of our teachers and support staff.

Our staff work closely with other staff across the Southern and Northern Yorke Peninsula Partnerships and are supported by the Kadina Portfolio LET.

Staff Utilisation Policies

There is an emphasis on non-teaching staff supporting student learning and Tier 2 staffing is directed toward One Plan students.

9. School Facilities

• School Community Library

The Minlaton School Community Library is a joint use venture between the Department for Education, Yorke Peninsula District Council and the Public Libraries Board of South Australia. The Minlaton School Community Library was established in 1980. In 2020 the library undertook an ambitious program to provide our students and the wider community with 'Minlaton StoryTime' in response to the Covid pandemic and gained a commendation in the LGA Awards for this work which was supported by school staff.

The Library aims to provide a quality library service to both the school

population and the Minlaton and District communities. Facilities such as free public access to the Internet and a wide range of resources including books, newspapers, magazines, DVDs, CDs, and videos are available to patrons. The Library is able to access resources both within South Australia and Australia wide. The communities of Port Vincent and Curramulka are serviced by Depot Libraries which are open once a week.

Buildings and Grounds

The standard of buildings and facilities is good and the extensive grounds are pleasant and functional. Significant upgrades to school building have been undertaken in the last 12 years through both government and site funding. A plan to make the grounds more environmentally friendly has been initiated.

Heating and Cooling

All general learning area classrooms are airconditioned.

Specialist Facilities

Gymnasium, Home Economics Centre, Technical Studies Centre, Science Labs, Art Studio, as well as computers in classrooms, wifi throughout, Middle School Learning street and large grassed/oval areas. We house components of the Southern Yorke Peninsula Trade Training Centre within our Home Ec and Tech Studies facilities.

Student Facilities

Canteen – The menu has a focus on healthy eating and is available 3 days per week.

Designated classroom blocks for Primary, Middle and Senior school classes.

Study room for senior secondary students who are off line – supervised for all lessons. Computer access available for all R-12 students, via a one to one student digital device program 6-12, and pods of laptops and iPads in the primary years.

Staff Facilities

Office space is available for staff preparation and there is adequate meeting space and relatively newly refurbished Admin area with staff facilities.

Access for Students and Staff with Disabilities

All areas of the school have wheel-chair access.

Access to Bus Transport

Private buses are available for excursions through a range of operators on the Yorke Peninsula.

10. School Operations

Decision Making Structures

These are clearly mapped for access by all members of the school community with management, staff meetings and Governing Council providing the main forums for discussion of issues and decision making. Separate sub school meetings deal with issues relevant to those parts of the school. All staff are involved in the implementation of agreed current school priorities through meetings and performance management.

Regular Publications

A school newsletter is distributed fortnightly via an email distribution list. Within school, staff and students communicate through Daymap where daily bulletins and message boards are used. 11. Local Community

General Characteristics

Minlaton is located in the centre of lower Yorke Peninsula with access to the seaside both east and west from the town. This provides opportunities for seaside recreation activities. The bottom end of the Peninsula is an easy afternoon's scenic drive with a burgeoning tourist trade.

The town and district support mainly agricultural activities with some small industry and tourism.

The township itself has a strong supportive community who work hard to present a neat, tidy town with a good variety of commercial services.

Minlaton is a comfortable two and a half hour drive from Adelaide.

• Parent and Community Involvement

Parents are involved in the school through the Governing Council, committees as required, and some classroom support.

The Minlaton Early Learning Centre operates Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Playgroup on Mondays and Occasional Care on Friday.

• Other Local Facilities

There are a range of churches and associated branches. Sporting facilities are well patronised and include, football, netball, golf, polocrosse, hockey, Indoor Basketball Stadium, tennis, table-tennis, gun club, lawn bowls, sailing, indoor soccer, cricket and tae kwon do. The local medical centre is a training facility managed by the University of Adelaide and provides a 9-5 weekday emergency clinic.

• Availability of Staff Housing

Government housing is very limited in Minlaton and surrounding towns. Private rental is generally available in most towns, particularly the coastal settlements. This has been limited during recent years as we have felt the impact of Covid.
